Dear friends,

We watched a version of Shakespeare's *As You Like It* yesterday, relayed from London's Globe Theatre. These online versions of theatrical productions have been an enjoyable pastime recently, and I was drawn to lines spoken by Duke Senior while in exile in the Forest of Arden: 'And this our life, exempt from public haunt, /Finds tongues in trees, books in the running brooks, /Sermons in stones, and good in everything.' As the sun has shone, it's indeed been possible to see new life and 'good in everything' in the natural world around us, even as so much hardship and suffering continues alongside this.

Here in the vicarage, it's been a particular pleasure, not only to spent time in the garden, but to begin, finally, to get to grips with its long grass. Cutting this has been quite arduous, with a small hand mower that scatters piles of shorn grass behind it. But I've been struck by the changes in colour, sensation and feeling, as thick shaggy coverage turns to a thin sheen of grey-silver on the ground. From a distance, the lawn seems, though shorter and a little more orderly, more monochrome and even rather dull. On applying a rake or, more usually, gathering cut grass by hand while kneeling and crawling, the shards of grass appear then disperse, and suddenly the bright young shoots underneath emerge, in all their lime-green yellow light and colour, with different textures, lengths and dappling effects.

Something a little like this experience is happening, as the disciples take refuge behind locked doors in the time after the first Easter appearance. Uncertainty, fear, disbelief are all still a backdrop, when joy might be assumed to be well established. The Christian story does not understand resurrection as a magical intervention that takes away in one moment all suffering or hardship. Clearly that continued in many forms for the early Christians, and sadly, it continues today as well, in our own lives and in those of others around us. But, like the suddenly textured, dappled shoots underneath the film of grey cut grass, the risen life of the resurrection opens up and makes suddenly real our vision for a different and better way, our capacity for hope, for love, for life, for starting again, however much grey doubt can overshadow when we are vulnerable. \rightarrow

But Easter gives us, steadily and quietly, that substantial reminder, breathing oxygen of hope into our spiritual and physical lungs, proclaiming that shoots of new life, new colour, new possibilities, are present, beneath that veneer of greyness and of sorrowing dullness, as the poet John Donne called it. Even alongside these doubts or uncertainty, runs a deeper vein of energy and of purpose, a new way of being which the risen life invites us to embrace. So as these weeks continue, may that hope, love purpose, go with you, whatever you are facing, wherever you are. And may we meet again soon.

HOLY TRINITY CHURCH CLOCK

Since 1870, the Holy Trinity Church Clock has told villagers the time and struck the hour. The ancient mechanism has been maintained by an annual service but recently the cogs which ring the hour gave up and the clock was silent. The services of a



horological engineer were needed and with the financial support of the Civic Society we are reminded of the hour again.

The clock has an eight day movement and until the mid



1980s someone had to climb the tower with a big key to wind it up every week. An electric self winding mechanism was then installed and the only manual correction now needed is the twice yearly adjustments for British Summer time.

Although the Neighbourhood Plan is finished and now ready for comment Covid 19 has delayed the process. The local consultation process has been extended – until the autumn or maybe longer. In addition the Government has delayed all elections and referenda till May 2021.

Nevertheless North Somerset Council are moving ahead with their long-term 2038 Local Plan and we are engaged. It is very good that we have our own plan ready to input to that process and we need to show that local opinion is in favour or against the proposals in the Plan.

Recycling and Rubbish:

Check North Somerset council website under waste and recycling for your next collection.



Recycling levels during the current Corona Virus emergency are much higher than usual. Please help the crews by making sure that your recycling is sorted. All waste and recycling is currently being collected, but should there be a problem with crew availability the green waste collections will be the first to be suspended.

The Recycling Centres are currently closed. Please keep your large items for recycling until they are reopened.

Recycling Tips Recycle all metal items

...such as old cooking utensils by taking them to the recycling centre near Portishead when it reopens. They will not be taken by the kerbside teams who only collect household metal packaging such as foil, tins, cans, lids from jars and foil trays.

Food waste

The average family throws away about £700 worth of food waste a year; most of it ends up in landfill. Please put your food waste into your food waste bin rather than your black wheelie bin. All food waste collected is sent to an anaerobic digestion plant in Weston-super-Mare, which generates electricity and produces fertiliser.

Plastic Bags

...can be recycled at a number of larger supermarkets including a lot of food packaging & magazine wrappers which are not biodegradable. Store the plastics in a plastic bag by your recycling bins and take it with you next time you go for a supermarket shop.

Use clothes longer

The average life of new clothes is only 3.3 years. Only 10% to 20% of clothes given to charity shops are sold in second hand stores. The rest is sent overseas.

FOOD BANK - MORE NEEDED THAN EVER

In response to an S.O.S from the N.W.Foodbank I delivered a large consignment of foodstuffs and toiletries to Avonmouth last week which had been donated to Holy Trinity and St. Mary's.

The position there is grim. All of their collection stations have been forced to close and donations have dwindled to a trickle. The hub at Avonmouth is trying to put together 1000 parcels for people and families who are having to self-isolate.

So please keep donations coming to both Churches and I will ensure they get to Avonmouth.

There are boxes in the porches of both Holy Trinity and St Mary's for the collection of items. They are regularly checked, emptied and taken to the Food Bank once a month.
