20,000 NEW HOUSES FOR NORTH SOMERSET

North Somerset Council have issued a 'Challenges for the Future' consultation paper in relation to their Local Plan 2038.

The government has set NSC a new, higher housing target of 20,500 new houses by 2038 and, notwithstanding the Government's recently announced planning reforms there is a real threat to the existing boundaries of the Green Belt and to the precious environment that we all value.

Despite what the Government says you may still get something you don't want.

The questions which arise include:

- ♦ Where should these 20,000 new houses go?
- ♦ Should there be adjustments to the Green Belt boundary?
- Should there be large new sites or smaller sites around existing settlements?
- ♦ Will sustainability lose out to economic priorities?
- ♦ What land will the Port Company need for future growth?

NSC is keen to move ahead with the Local Plan and consultation on *Challenges for the Future* ends on September 2nd. By the time you read this LINK the Parish Council will have made its submission, but if you think some or all of the questions above are important there is still time to make your views known.

Bored as you may be to have to read yet again about the NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN, it does actually try to address the questions raised by the NSC document. The Plan will be submitted to NSC in October and will carry more weight if it is supported with views from more than a handful of residents.

You can learn about the Government's planning reforms, the North Somerset Local Plan and how the Neighbourhood Plan fits in at two drop-in sessions in September. It's the last chance to make a comment on the Plan.

Abbots Pool

It has been very sad that Abbots Pool has had to be closed by North Somerset Council following increased concerns for public health and issues with environmental damage and anti-social behaviour.

Unfortunately there have been a lot of people who are determined to continue to break into the pool area in addition to organised parties being held.

The positive points are that the number visiting is reduced, and that in spite of the numbers, there is not as much litter being left as earlier. A number of local people are also doing litter picks and the site is not looking too untidy any more.

NSC are in the process of setting up a Public Space Protection Order for the reserve which will include a number of bylaws which could be enforced with the fines being imposed. The process and consultation take time, but hopefully it will be completed before too long.

The pool will be re-opened when the weather makes it not so attractive for large numbers to congregate there, and also when the new bylaws can be enforced.

The parking restrictions will be lifted at around the same time.

The Pool remains closed at the moment and we are unsure when it will reopen. NSC may want to keep it closed until the site protection order is in place. We would like to plan a Working party on Sunday 20th September. We hope the pool will be open by then but if not we will organise access into the carpark at 10am. I will advise closer to the time. We will be litter picking, clearing the dam and the cave, clearing paths of summer growth, and tidying up the Cascade.

Come and join us and help maintain the treasure on our doorstep.

Wow!

I don't think I've ever had so much response from a Link article as last month's effort on Bristol and Abbots Leigh's position in the history of slave trading.

Most responses were positive. Others less so.

But that's ok, it's a controversial subject that splits opinion.

Thankfully everyone recognised the wickedness of the slave trade, the main controversy being how we as a populace should move forward to ensure such horrific practices never happen again.

Unfortunately the scourge of modern-day slavery – the exploitation of others for commercial gain in factories, textile sweat-shops, crop-picking or as nannies, cleaners and cooks – lies uncomfortably close to home.

But while we should look to do everything we can to help alleviate the suffering of those today, it doesn't mean we should turn our back on that imposed on those unfortunate enough through nothing but the lottery of birth, to be forced to work for others against their will in the past.

We quite rightly remember the bloody sacrifice of those villagers who fought and died in the two World Wars. Similarly we should not forget the impact some Abbots Leighan's had on the unfair shaping of today's society and through that, the impact they are still having.

As far as societal impacts go, that reaped by Coronavirus looks difficult to best. Aside from the terrible death-toll around the world, it will be many years before its terrible influence on our lives and livelihoods starts to work its way out.

It's also put the kybosh on the **Festival in the Field** this year and with **Bonfire Night** just around the corner, that is under real threat too.

And as restrictions start to ease, the team at **The George** is working hard to try and provide the village with an experience as close to normal as can be safely managed.

Pete, Flo, Trudie and Phil are doing their level best to make sure it doesn't become adversely impacted by Covid 19 but they need our support in doing so. It's open all day from Wednesday to Sunday. Even if you don't fancy a pint or glass of wine the coffee is excellent.

It's worth noting that they helped source bread, milk, groceries, meat and fish for plenty in Abbots Leigh during early lockdown and that the pub was deemed such an important part of village life that a few years ago North Somerset Council listed it an *Asset of Community Value* following lobbying by the Civic Society and an application by the Parish Council. Now more than ever it's up to us to prove its value and help it through these Covid concerns, helping it come back stronger than ever.

As an aside I sincerely hope that my natural Midland pessimism over Bonfire Night is misplaced. It's my favourite village event of the year. Always fun and always busy. We could all do with a blast of that.

COVID-19 has made us all realise what's really important to us – our family, our friends and our health. We have had to adapt and make changes to our daily lives.

Whilst the authorities continue to monitor COVID-19, it is hoped that, over recent months, many Leigh Woods residents have been able to see family and friends.

The local COVID19 Community Support Group initiative has been successful in bringing the community closer together. The support groups in Abbots Leigh and Leigh Woods, comprise of volunteers who live in the area.

If you are self isolating and need support please contact your volunteer in the first instance, any problems let the coordinators know. COVID-19 Community Support Group is co-ordinated by Gill Dixon and Mark Rayson. They can be contacted via covid19@leighwoods.org Both can also be contacted by landline on 0117 973 1842.

Our website www.leighwoods.org has a dedicated COVID19 page with helpful information on a range of issues ranging from health to food and shopping delivery services.

The website also has some advice on cyber security. The criminal community is looking for new opportunities in these difficult times, with recent warnings about virus related bogus phone calls and scams.

Please have a look at the website and let us know if there is any information on Leigh Woods you feel it would be helpful to include.

We are looking forward to a time when the LWS can rearrange the AGM; organise a quiz or two; improve the area by organising a litter pick; take the opportunity to listen to interesting talks by our local residents; and hopefully have a party celebration for residents to get together and importantly for our new residents to get to know their neighbours.

Meanwhile, the LWS has actively supported the Food Bank. Many local people have supported the Church's efforts to collect donations for a local food bank. Donations may be left in the plastic containers in the porch of St Mary's Church. Local food banks continue to need our support more than ever at the moment.

The lockdown has reinforced how important fresh air and green space are to us all, both physically and mentally. Leigh Woods and Ashton Court have played an important role over recent months as a 'green lung' for surrounding urban areas. These fantastic green spaces on our doorstep, have a rich variety of trees, (including veteran and ancient trees), grasslands, native flora and abundant wild flowers. They are also home to an array of local wildlife including bats, insects, animals and reptiles. Since late July, Leigh Woods has welcomed the return of a small herd of Devon cows to help with restoration of the pastures in the woods.

Unfortunately at times the area has been too popular and a variety of associated problems continue to concern local residents, including the increase in litter. Big thank you to our local litter pickers who have continued to help, particularly on the grass verges.

Inconsiderate parking has been another impact on local residents. In late July, the Forestry Commission introduced car parking charges in the main Leigh Woods car park. The machines accept card payment only. Car Parking Charges (up to to 2 hours £2.00, up to 4 hours £4.00.) Regular visitors can save money with a membership pass.

cost of £80 per year. The impact on the North Road entrance will be closely watched.

With regard to North Somerset Council matters, a survey on a new Parking plan for Leigh Woods was undertaken earlier this year. The results are being coordinated for the Council who will then decide how to proceed. No decision yet by NSC.

There have been changes in traffic arrangements, in Clifton village. A temporary traffic management scheme is in place allowing for some outdoor trading & parking. Over coming months Bristol City Council will establish a focus group to consider traffic management in the whole village. They have committed to a public consultation in due course.

'Lest we forget'

The LWS is supporting the Ground Breaking Ceremony for the new Long Ashton Parish War Memorial, taking place on Battle of Britain Day, Tue. 15 Sept., at the Flagpole, opposite Old Northleaze School, where most of the Fallen from the World Wars went to school.

The short service will start at 10.55am,led by The Vicar, Rev James Harris, and Sqn Ldr Taylor, RAF, will perform the removal of the first turf, ready for the construction to start.

The New Memorial, of modern design, designed by local Architect Alan Atkins, and listing all 97 Fallen from the Parish, including LW locals Charles Davey and Edwin Popert, will be completed over the winter, and the Dedication will be carried out on Monday, 12th April 2021, eighty years to the day since the only civilians were killed in the parish due to enemy action, when the Mill Cottages were bombed on Good Friday, 1941. More information nearer the day.

RECYCLING AND RUBBISH

Check North Somerset council website under waste and recycling for your next collection.

Advice from North Somerset Council continues to be:

Our crews are very busy at the moment. To help keep you and them safe, and to help the crews keep making their collections in good time, there are a few things you can do to help:

The main grumbles that the recycling crews have are:-

- Items are not rinsed before being put out for recycling
- Some people put out used tissues; they must be bagged and put in the general waste.
- There is a risk of their having to pick up broken glass. If glass is already broken wrap it up and put it into the general waste. Do not put glass in anything other than the standard recycling boxes which can be hooked onto the side of the lorry

The Recycling Centres are open to a reduced extent. The limitations of one visit per month have been lifted. Check North Somerset website for specific times as they are limiting access on different days by car registration numbers. With an odd last number in your vehicle registration you can visit on Monday, Thursday or Saturday, with and even number you can visit on Wednesday, Friday or Sunday. When visiting Portishead Black Rock recycling centre there is a one way system in place and it is not possible to make a right turn to enter or exit the site. To enter you must turn left coming down Valley road and to exit turn left towards Clevedon Road B3123.

Recycling Tips

Food waste

The average family throws away about £700 worth of food waste a year and most of it ends up in landfill. Please put your food waste into your food waste bin rather than into your black wheelie bin.

Plastic Bags

These can be recycled at a number of larger supermarkets including a lot of food packaging and magazine wrappers which are not biodegradable.

Adrian's one pot fish dish for sea bream, cod, hake or salmon



Ingredients: potatoes thinly sliced, handful of small tomatoes, quite a lot of capers, a clove or two of garlic (chopped), a glass of white wine - Sauvignon Blanc, Picpoul, Muscadet, Verdicchio

Method: Throw ingredients into a shallow ovenproof dish and mix together with some olive oil.

Season and bake in a hot oven for 30 mins. Open a bottle of the wine, put a glassful into the mix and return to the oven for the time it takes you to enjoy a glass of the wine.



Place your fish on top and return to the oven for 15 - 20 minutes depending on the size of the fish.

Serve with a sprinkling of parsley, slices of lemon and whatever vegetables you have. Beetroot and beans go well.

NEW PUBLIC, WILDFLOWER MEADOW IN VILLAGE

We are upgrading the wild grassy area around the bus stop opposite Sandy Lane. We are calling it Pound Batch Wildflower Meadow. It will not be like garden but a natural wildflower meadow in a few summers! We would like to create a beauty spot for local plants, people

and passers-by. We have the backing of Civic Society and Parish Council to work on the land. All help and involvement welcome, especially collecting local seeds of native flowers you would like to see in that spot!

HOW TO COLLECT SEEDS:

Gather the seeds when they are fully ripened, but BEFORE they naturally disperse or start to rot. Please only harvest some of the seed from any location, leaving some behind! When they have been collected you need to dry them fully before placing them in zip lock bags or envelope. Please label the bag / envelope and ideally add a photo of the flower, or the flower itself from the same plant (pressed or dried). Then store in the coldest part of the fridge for a few weeks, as many seeds will only germinate after they have experienced a winter.
