Dear Friends.

I've heard so often in recent weeks, 'This feels like the longest winter'. Sometimes, 'longest' has been replaced by 'darkest' or 'wettest' or 'coldest'. But there is something that feels, even for those who've lived through a lot of dark winters, extreme and gruelling about this one. As I write this on Ash Wednesday, we're invited to take on a discipline of prayer, fasting and generosity, to mark the season of Lent. Many of us may be feeling that it's been like Lent for about a year, on and off – and we don't want to give anything else up, thank you very much! And I think that would be an understandable response. But perhaps we can approach the season in a different way, and see the last months as a training opportunity, from which we can now reap some small spiritual benefit. Because as the season opens out, we're in fact moving towards the light, with those beautiful snowdrops and crocuses everywhere to be seen in the parish; with many among us now partly vaccinated, at least; and the possibility of schools reopening, for those who've been offering months of home education, as further source of hope. And as many of us have had to adjust to limited living, we perhaps enter Lent more sharply alert to the gifts of life, freedom and relationship which are our customary blessings. Perhaps we can offer the next few weeks, then, with this prospect of greater freedom in view, to nurture a sense of gratitude for our good fortunes, an instinct for generosity and compassion for those who are worse off than ourselves; and an awareness of our dependence on one another, and on the good of the whole world.

Do join us in our combined Lent Group this year with the parish of All Saints Clifton: we will circulate the Zoom link and the groups will be meeting on Wednesdays at 2pm/7pm for an hour, with the book 'In all seasons, for all reasons' a focus for thoughts on prayer.

LEIGH WOODS SOCIETY

March sees the first anniversary of the first lockdown and, a year on, there may be hopeful signs of better times ahead when we can meet again. The society has continued to work quietly in the background as there are issues of concern, which are being addressed. Indeed, the society had a meeting online at the end of January to discuss the range of issues which concern residents and some of these issues are noted below.

Leigh Woods As previously reported in 'The Link', parking restrictions were hastily introduced in order to help compliance with social distancing during the first lockdown. These seem to have helped, although the growing number of visitors to the woods has continued and is more than likely to increase still further as spring approaches. This area is particularly popular at the weekend, as is to be expected. Police/traffic warden presence has been promised during peak times to help maintain a safe flow of both traffic and visitors.

Verges The recent filming on North Road resulted in further damage to the grass verges. The company has been contacted and has assured the society that the damage will be made good. Of crucial importance is the timing because the ideal situation would be to effect repairs when the parking scheme has been fully implemented and the weather is drier, thus eliminating some of the additional damage caused by the increased footfall and the mounting onto the verges of cars which are allowing other vehicles to pass along the road. Suggestions about how to protect the verges subsequently have been proposed although no final decision has been reached; any solution must be pleasing aesthetically and sustainable environmentally. The verges are a very important part of our environment.

Parking The completion of the scheme is still officially scheduled for April although this may not in fact happen until later in the summer. An update will appear here as soon as any information becomes available. It is important to emphasise that the works undertaken so far were only partial. As an example, parking has increased in Church Road adjacent to the church (further damaging verges at that point) but this section is scheduled to be part of the final implementation of the parking scheme. It is understood that further consultation with the community will occur prior to the implementation of the scheme.

Community needs The absence of any hub or meeting point in Leigh Woods has resulted in a discussion on using the church building more, which would certainly be welcomed by the church authorities. In fact, the cancelled summer party 2020 was due to have taken place in the church grounds. There are of course acknowledged sensitivities around using the church, yet it is the only permanent structure in Leigh Woods and it may make sense to take advantage of its availability. The discussion will continue and the views of members of the society and the wider community will be sought.

Crime A reminder to be vigilant. Greater numbers of visitors may present a situation where an opportunist burglar can slip through unnoticed. Our police contact: justina.lewis@ayonandsomerset.police.uk

Meetings The society committee is continuing to meet online. The AGM in March 2020 was cancelled, but it is hoped that the AGM 2021 will take place at some point this year. Experience teaches us that it would be unwise to suggest any date, but notice of an AGM will go out as soon as legislation indicates that it would be safe to meet.

Subscriptions to the Society 2021 The committee decided that these would not be collected in 2021. Reimbursements have been made to those who did pay

Thoughts on the future This has been a time for reflection and various thoughts on the Leigh Woods Society have been discussed over recent months. The committee is going to have a further discussion later this month and will open up the discussion to members so that the widest possible array of views may be taken into consideration.

North Somerset

Submission Consultation February 2021

You will remember that in the February LINK we highlighted the YOUR PLAN; YOUR SAY consultation being conducted by North Somerset Council. The Plan will help to shape development up to 2026 and will be used to help to make decisions on planning applications. This is the last chance before a final summer referendum to influence the Neighbourhood Plan.

You can find out more and view the Plan on the Village web-site (under Neighbourhood Plan within Parish Council). Comments can be made online until **March 15th**.to www.n-somerset.gov.uk/pillplan

Policies include:-

- Investigation of a Conservation area for Abbots Leigh
- Limitations on traffic on the A369
- Protection of the local natural and historic environment,
- Site allocations for affordable housing and a care home at Ham Green,
- Policies to counter climate change and stimulate low energy use, walking, cycling and public transport.

It is important that as many people as possible make it known to North Somerset that the Plan is welcome and does as much as possible to protect and enhance the parish.

There are many differing views about the most important issues and some parts of the Plan may seem contradictory to others. Meeting housing needs can conflict with environmental conservation; new development may create traffic and fail to encourage walking and cycling. There have therefore been compromises which we hope Abbots Leigh residents will understand and respect. **Please make your views known to NSC.**

North Somerset Local Plan 2038

Alongside the Neighbourhood Plan to 2026 we have been working to influence the forthcoming North Somerset Local Plan 2038. We made a submission to the recent consultation (see the February LINK) and North Somerset have now published a report on that consultation. Many of the issues raised in our submission which mirrored the priorities of the Neighbourhood Plan – have been recognised, notably the levels of congestion, pollution and safety on the A|369, the protection and enhancement of the environment, the importance of local character and heritage and the need to avoid major development at Chapel Pill and/or Martcombe. This is not to say that these concerns will be incorporated in the new NSC Local Plan but it seems a good start. All the more reason to comment on the Neighbourhood Plan consultation. **Have your Say. Support the proposals.**

ABBOTS LEIGH PARISH COUNCIL

A CONSERVATION AREA WITHIN ABBOTS LEIGH?

Over the next few months the Parish Council will be seeking to establish what level of support residents have for living within a potential Conservation Area in our Village.

Residents who wish to know more about the practicalities of "Living in a Conservation Area" can download the North Somerset Information Sheet of that name, published in 2019. It is available on North Somerset Council's Planning Website in the Heritage and Conservation Section. It will also be available via the Abbots Leigh Parish Council Section of the Village Website (abbotsleigh.org.uk).

An interesting statistic the document highlights is that, on average, houses within Conservation Areas sell at a 9% premium over those outside of them.

A Brief History of Church Road by the Village's Heritage Group, subtitled The Oldest Street in the Village, was published in June 2018 and is also available to download via the Village Website. This provides a fascinating and very interesting focus on the history and heritage of Church Road. It is a good read and provides plenty of reasons for supporting the principle of conserving the character of Church Road.

RECYCLING AND RUBBISH

From April Recycling and waste services will be carried out by North Somerset Recycling Company, a new company being set up by North Somerset Council using the existing staff, as the contract with Biffa is being terminated by mutual agreement.

Collection days vary across Abbots Leigh and Leigh Woods. If in doubt about your next collection dates check on North Somerset Council website under waste collections where you can also download your Recycling and Waste collection calendars.

Garden Waste Garden waste collections will be back to normal in March. Check your calendar on North Somerset Website for collection days.

Recycling Centre at Black Rock, Portishead Closed on Tuesdays.

Summer times from the beginning of March are 8am to 6pm on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 10am to 6pm on Thursday, 9am to 6pm on Saturday and 9am to 5pm on Sundays and Bank Holidays. When visiting Portishead recycling centre there is a one way system in place and it is not possible to make a right turn to enter or exit the site. To enter you must turn left coming down Valley Road and to exit turn left towards Clevedon Road B3123.

Food waste Lots of people still put food waste in with the general rubbish. The average family throws away about £700 worth of food waste a year and most of it ends up in landfill. Please put your food waste into your food waste bin rather than into your black wheelie bin so that it can be used to generate electricity and provide heat for homes **Plastic Bags** A lot of these can be recycled at a number of larger

supermarkets including a lot of food packaging and magazine wrappers which are not biodegradable. Read the packaging labels which say "recycle with bags at larger stores".

A369 Cycle path



We are delighted that North Somerset Council have raised and resurfaced the cycle path opposite Ashgrove Avenue by the exit from Clifton College

Ashgrove Avenue It Sports grounds and have installed an additional gulley. This area of the path was repeatedly flooded for over 20 years

for over 20 years and these works will ensure that cyclists no longer have to cycle through a flood or the residual mud on their journeys to Clifton which put people off using the path.

ADRIAN'S Recipe of the month DUCK LEGS ON A BED OF SWEET POTATO

Ingredients: Two duck leg joints. One large sweet potato. A few shallots. A couple of sticks of celery. A little goose fat. A bottle of Rosé wine.

Method: Peel the sweet potato and cut into thick slices. Cut up the celery and peel the shallots - this a little tedious but much easier if you first stand them in boiling water for a few minutes. Put a very small amount of goose fat into a shallow cooking pot and then spread out the vegetables. Rub some salt into the skin on the duck legs and nestle them onto the vegetables. Start off the cooking at



around 160 - 180C. After 30 minutes check how it's all going. If it's looking a little dry, throw in a splash of Rosé wine and have some yourself. The delicious juices from the duck will be basting the vegetables. Finish under a hot grill until the skin on the duck is nicely crisped. Plate up with more vegetables. Peas have a great affinity with duck. Braised red cabbage complements the sweetness of this dish. Enjoy as you think about summer holidays in France.






