LEIGH WOODS SOCIETY

With children back in schools, an increasing number of our residents being vaccinated and government restrictions starting to be lifted, everything seems to be moving, slowly, in the right direction.

Our local concerns and initiatives seem small relative to a pandemic but, unlike the pandemic, they are things over which we have some control. Many of these were set out by Alex Burgh, the Society's Chair, in a recent letter to members, and are summarised below.

Parking. We understand that there will be another consultation before the agreed parking scheme is implemented. No firm dates have been set yet but we understand we might be looking at April onwards.

Verges. The random parking experienced early on in the lockdown meant damage was caused to our verges. The yellow lines in North Rd opposite Overton Court exacerbated the problem in that cars are mounting the verge to make way for oncoming traffic. Of course the film company, as they said in their recent letter, will make good the damage caused by them once the weather improves.

Crime. There has been an increase in crime in our area. The police response to individual cases has been swift, which is reassuring; however we need to be vigilant.

St Mary's Church. The church is very keen to make this wonderful place more accessible to LW residents for community events, meetings, gatherings etc. The church is also planning to clear a lot of the undergrowth in the church grounds to improve appearance and create areas for people to use and enjoy. We all, parishioners of the United Parish, can help! See below.

Abbots Pool new Public Space Protection Order

From 1st April a new Public Space Protection will be in place covering Abbots Pool which will prohibit swimming, bathing wading or jumping into the water. This will be in addition to district wide orders requiring people to stop consuming alcohol or drugs when asked to do so, surrender alcohol or drugs when asked to do so, stop playing music or instruments when asked to do so, together with a number of dog control and public health measures. The fine for breaching a PSPO is £75 reducing to £50 if paid within 10 days. PSPOs can be enforced by council enforcement officers, police and police community safety officers. New signing is being introduced to advise people that these orders are in place. It is hoped that these measures will lead to the area being treated with respect as a local nature reserve for the enjoyment of all visitors.

A CONSERVATION AREA WITHIN ABBOTS LEIGH?

Over the next few months the Parish Council will be seeking to establish what level of support residents have for living within a potential Conservation Area in our Village.

Residents who wish to know more about the practicalities of "Living in a Conservation Area" can download the North Somerset Information Sheet of that name, published in 2019. It is available on North Somerset Council's Planning Website in the Heritage and Conservation Section. It will also be available via the Abbots Leigh Parish Council Section of the Village Website (abbotsleigh.org.uk).

An interesting statistic the document highlights is that, on average, houses within Conservation Areas sell at a 9% premium over those outside of them.

A Brief History of Church Road by the Village's Heritage Group, subtitled The Oldest Street in the Village, was published in June 2018 and is also available to download via the Village Website. This provides a fascinating and very interesting focus on the history and heritage of Church Road. It is a good read and provides plenty of reasons for supporting the principle of conserving the character of Church Road.

RECYCLING AND RUBBISH

From April Recycling and waste services will be carried out by North Somerset Recycling Company, a new company being set up by North Somerset Council using the existing staff, as the contract with Biffa is being terminated by mutual agreement.

Collection days vary across Abbots Leigh and Leigh Woods. If in doubt about your next collection dates check on North Somerset Council website under waste collections where you can also download your Recycling and Waste collection calendars.

Garden Waste

A new annual charge of £50 per garden waste bin is coming in April. There is an early-bird discount of 10% on the first bin and the deadline for that discount has been extended to Friday 16th April. Maximum of 2 bins per household. If you get a council tax discount on account of single person occupancy or for any other reason there is a reduced charge for your garden waste bins.

Recycling Centre at Black Rock, Portishead

Closed on Tuesdays. Summer times are 8am to 6pm on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 10am to 6pm on Thursday, 9am to 6pm on Saturday and 9am to 5pm on Sundays and Bank Holidays. When visiting Portishead recycling centre there is a one way system in place and it is not possible to make a right turn to enter or exit the site. To enter you must turn left coming down Valley road and to exit turn left towards Clevedon Road B3123.

Food waste

In the recent North Somerset Council household waste audit it was found that 45% of the residual general waste could have been recycled, 27% was food waste. The average family throws away about £700 worth of food waste a year and most of it ends up in landfill. Please help to reduce the amount of your general waste and put your food waste to better use. Put it into your food waste bin rather than into your black wheelie bin so that it can be used to generate electricity and provide heat for homes.

Plastic Bags

A lot of these can be recycled at a number of larger supermarkets including a lot of food packaging and magazine wrappers which are not biodegradable. Read the packaging labels which say "recycle with bags at larger stores".

ADRIAN'S Recipe of the month SALMON, SWEET POTATO and SWEET CORN THAI CURRY

INGREDIENTS:

- Skinless salmon fillets cut into chunks.
- One onion.
- · Two cloves of garlic.
- A chunk of fresh ginger grated or chopped.
- A small green chilli.

METHOD:

Chop the onion, garlic and deseeded chilli then cook in a little oil until just starting to brown. Add the coconut milk, fish stock and a couple of teaspoons of curry powder. Simmer gently for 10 minutes then add the sweet potato and sweetcorn. Simmer for another 10 minutes until the potato is cooked and the sauce reduced. Drop in the salmon chunks and cook for another 10 minutes. Plate up and sprinkle with coriander then serve with naan bread. Cabbage and peas spiced up with sautéed mustard
