# Trees for bees

When planting and promoting flowers for pollinators, think 3D! Trees which are not wind-pollinated provide an abundance of nectar and pollen for insects in a space-efficient way. Different species cover the whole season from as early as February, when fewer flowers are available on the ground. Good examples are Sallow, other Willows and some early Cherries, followed by Blackthorn, Hawthorn, Maples and Sycamore, Rowan and many fruit trees like Apple, Pear and Plums.

For those fortunate to live in Leigh Woods, life has been tolerable and safe over the past year and there has been a sense of community, albeit with limited contact over the period amongst all residents. However, we are planning some initial events to bring everyone together, within the new guidelines. These include a Litter Pick, a 'spectacular' Summer Party and the re-start of the Leigh Woods/Abbots Leigh Cinema Club.

The new War Memorial for Long Ashton and Leigh Woods personnel who died in WW1 (104 names from the Parish) was unveiled on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> April. Mrs Annie Maw, Lord Lieutenant of Somerset, was kind enough to attend. The LLs Cadet, Bethany Scott is shown actually releasing the Union Flag which covered the Memorial for Mrs Maw. It was hoped that HRH the Princess Royal to join the event, but understandably, arrangements were changed at the last minute. We mourn the loss of the Duke of Edinburgh and wish the Queen and the Royal Family a long life. It was a moving ceremony. So many dead from two world wars and not forgetting David Addis's son who fell in Bosnia.

# The Future of the Leigh Woods Society (LWS)

Recent discussions about the future direction of the LWS have been prompted by the inability to hold an AGM, the end of their 3-year term for the 3 elected officers and the need to reconfirm other Committee members. Alex Burgh - Chairman, Bill Summers - Treasurer and Martin Jenkins – Secretary have done a great job in their respective roles since being elected. They, together with the other Committee members, have continued over the past year behind the scenes without a formal mandate from the members, as outlined in the LWS constitution.

The uncertainty about the LWS and how it should evolve as a Residents' group in this 'new world' caused me to reflect on how great a community I live in. When Sue and I moved to Leigh Woods in July 2012 we were warmly welcomed by everyone we met (and all new people we have met since). We attended the summer party at John and Sally Sparks' garden (in the rain) within a week of arriving and met lots of interesting and friendly people. I was also invited to join the LWS and its Committee by Kate Buss at the Party. Both of which I did within the next month. I think the Community of Leigh Woods is exceptional and the area unique in its compact and open nature, as well as its closeness to all the Bristol and Somerset facilities. As we think about the future, it's important that this sense of community and belonging is continued and built upon.

By now, many of you will have received a personal letter from Alex Burgh outlining our current position as a Residents' organisation and the fact we have reached a crossroads for all

# **Bridge Closures**

A three-day off-peak closure of the Clifton Suspension Bridge between Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May and Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> May 2021 for engineering inspections of the underside of the bridge and its iron chains plus completion of other annual maintenance tasks. To enable these essential works to be carried out, the bridge will be closed to traffic and cyclists for three days, from 9.30am to 3.30pm each day. Pedestrians will not be affected.

# Parking in Leigh Woods

There is no further information to report of the implementation of the new Parking scheme within Leigh Woods. However, vehicles are being parked and left in Leigh Woods (e.g. a Travellers Van that has been parked for several weeks was recently reported to the NSC who are now dealing with it). Residents should watch for other such vehicles or camper vans parking here freely for more than a night and pass on the information to the NSC to follow up.

# Ticks in Leigh Woods (National Trust)

A rock climber recently reported that he picked up a tick in Leigh Woods. So, ticks are out and about again and looking for blood! Since it is possible to catch Lyme's Disease from ticks, everyone should be aware, especially when walking or sitting in the tall grass with the Leigh Woods/Forestry Commission areas.

# St Mary's Renovations

The plans for renovating and modernising the Vestry, Kitchen and Toilet areas on the Church are being finalised and it is hoped the new space and facilities will be ready to use for Community events and Residents late Autumn.

# St Mary's Church Gardens

We are delighted to let you know that the Church gardens now have some new paths to explore. Thanks to a generous contribution by a local resident and gratefully received 'men with machine' support from ProTidy, meandering paths through the woodlands to both the north west and south east of the church, within the church grounds have been created, along with a small circular clearing. We intend to surface the paths with wood clippings. The hope is that LW residents, especially parents with younger children, will enjoy the new areas, to play, to be at one with nature, for quiet reflection, or perhaps for a picnic on a blanket in the clearing. We aim to start a community working party, meeting once a month on the second Saturday of every month between 09:30 and 12:30, starting on the 8th May, to maintain and improve the gardens. These monthly events, suitable for adults and children alike, will involving camaraderie combined with some light maintenance. Please join us any time between those hours, bringing a few tools if you have them, such as a wheel barrow, secateurs, sheers, spade, shovel, fork; and remember to bring gloves and sturdy footwear. We might also be able to use these monthly opportunities to assist those volunteers amongst us who maintain the beautiful borders in front of the church. Do explore the new paths and small clearing, and please join us on Saturday 8th May any time from 09:30 for our first working party.

# RECYCLING AND RUBBISH

Recycling and waste services are now being carried out by North Somerset Environment Company (NSEC), a new company being set up by North Somerset Council using the existing staff.

Collection days vary across Abbots Leigh and Leigh Woods. If in doubt about your next collection dates check on North Somerset Council website under waste collections where you can also download your Recycling and Waste collection calendars.



### **Garden Waste**

A new annual charge of £50 per garden waste bin is in place. If you haven't yet signed up you need to do so straight away, as if you do not have permits on your green bins they will not be collected. Maximum of 2 bins per household. If you get a council tax discount on account of single person occupancy or for any other reason there is a reduced charge for your garden waste bins.

# Recycling Centre at Black Rock, Portishead

Closed on Tuesdays. Summer times are 8am to 6pm on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 10am to 6pm on Thursday, 9am to 6pm on Saturday and 9am to 5pm on Sundays and Bank Holidays. When visiting Portishead recycling centre there is a one way system in place and it is not possible to make a right turn to enter or exit the site. To enter you must turn left coming down Valley road and to exit turn left towards Clevedon Road B3123.

## Food waste

In the recent North Somerset Council household waste audit it was found that 45% of the residual general waste could have been recycled, 27% was food waste. The average family throws away about £700 worth of food waste a year and most of it ends up in landfill. Please help to reduce the amount of your general waste and put your food waste to better use. Put it into your food waste bin rather than into your black wheelie bin so that it can be used to generate electricity and provide heat for homes.

## Plastic Bags

A lot of these can be recycled at a number of larger supermarkets including a lot of food packaging and magazine wrappers which are not biodegradable. Read the packaging labels which say "recycle with bags at larger stores".

# Abbots Pool new Public Space Protection Order

A Public Space Protection Order is now in place covering Abbots Pool which prohibits swimming, bathing wading or jumping into the water. This will be in addition to district wide orders requiring people to stop consuming alcohol or drugs when asked to do so, surrender alcohol or drugs when asked to do so, stop playing music or instruments when asked to do so, together with a number of dog control and public health measures. The fine for breaching a PSPO is £75 reducing to £50 if paid within 10 days. PSPOs are being enforced by council enforcement officers, police and police community safety officers. Signing is in place to advise people that these orders are in place. So far the cool weather has helped to reduced antisocial social behaviour and to is hoped that these measures will ensure that the area is treated with respect as a local nature reserve for the enjoyment of all visitors. If you see people failing to comply with these orders please call the Police on 101 as a record of the number of breaches helps the enforcing authorities determine the resources need to manage the enforcement.

# ABBOTS LEIGH PARISH COUNCIL Neighbourhood Plan

The final consultation ended on March 15th and the results are now with the Independent Examiner. North Somerset officers divided around 150 responses into comments organised around the themes of the various chapters in the Plan – some people made comments on several different chapters and the end result is 349 comments altogether!!

The comments are now available on the North Somerset Council web-site. Search for 'Pill Consultation' and you will find the Plan page with all the documents associated with the Plan. You can see there the *Examination Arrangements* which tells you what the Examiner is doing and how long he thinks it will take. Also, a *Clarification Note* in which he makes a few comments and asks a number of questions on things he wants clarified. There is also a link to a *Consultation web page* where there is information about who responded to consultation and what they said.

It is not for us to second guess the examiner but a few points emerge from the Clarification Note.

- The Examiner recognises the vision of the Neighbourhood Plan (NP), its presentation and layout, and the focus and direction it provides. He observes that the process is an excellent example of a community and parish council driven Plan.
- He asks about the period to which the Plan applies, and in particular its relationship with the new North Somerset Local Plan 2038. Does the Neighbourhood Plan preempt the Local Plan? Is it 'premature'?
- The examiner asks about some specific policies recommended in the Plan and suggest some might be 'Community Actions'.
- Finally, he asks for the Parish Councils' view on the responses, both in general and in relation to eight submissions in particular six of them from the development industry, one from Natural England and one from 'Ham Green Residents and other supporters'.

The Parish Councils' response to the Examiner will probably go onto the web-site at some point. In the meantime the Examiner may issue his report sometime in early to mid-May. Depending on what he says the Plan will be updated and, subject to a positive recommendation from the Examiner, North Somerset Council will be able to organise – and pay for - a referendum.

# ADRIAN'S recipe of the month. ASPARAGUS & LEMON RISOTTO WITH SCALLOPS AND CRISPY BACON

# Ingredients:

- 150 gm Arborio rice
- 1 small onion
- A clove of garlic, finely chopped
- · A glass of white wine
- The grated rind of 1/2 lemon
- · A bundle of asparagus
- 300ml vegetable stock
- · A dash of olive oil
- · 3 rashers of bacon
- · 6 plump queen scallops

**Method:** Steam the asparagus for a few minutes, blanch in cold water and chop into short lengths and put on one side. Sauté the onion in the olive oil. Do not let it brown. Add the garlic and tip in the rice stirring it well to coat the grains with oil. Add the lemon rind and the wine then gradually add the stock stirring as you go. Cover between additions. When the rice is nearly cooked, add the asparagus.

When the risotto is almost finished, cut the bacon into lardons and toss in a hot frying pan until brown and crispy. Move



them to one side and cook the scallops for a very few minutes, turning until they are nicely caramelised on both sides. Serve on the risotto. A wine with a whiff of the sea such as Muscadet from the westerly end of the Loire would work well with this dish.


