Abbots Pool Working Party

May's working party was a surprisingly pleasant morning, we were all expecting it be throwing it down but the sun shone and its was a lovely morning.

We laid the last of the gravel on the muddy patches around the pool, we also did further dead hedging.

The Team would like to thank everyone who has been picking litter throughout the month, as there wasn't our usual haul.

Next working party is Sunday 13th June. We are going to start the process of dredging the cave out; there is a build-up of debris in the cave that is making it very easy to access. The plan is to dredge by hand and leave the debris on the side for a number of days so that any creatures can return to the water. We are also going to block off a few of the numerous paths that are popping up and being used by Mountain bikers on the Village side of the valley and instal some bike racks for people to lock their bikes to.

Enforcement at Abbots Pool

A Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) is now in place covering Abbots Pool which prohibits swimming, bathing wading or jumping into the water. This will be in addition to district-wide orders requiring people to stop consuming alcohol or drugs when asked to do so, surrender alcohol or drugs when asked to do so, stop playing music or instruments when asked to do so, together with a number of dog control and public health measures.

Enforcement is being shared between the police and the council. The fine for breaching a PSPO is £75 reducing to £50 if paid within 10 days and will be issued by council enforcement officers, police and police community support officers (PCSOs).

Signing is in place to advise people that these orders are in place. So far the cool weather has helped to reduce antisocial behaviour and it is hoped that these measures will ensure that the area is treated with respect as a local nature reserve for the enjoyment of all visitors. If you see people failing to comply with these orders please call the Police on 101 as a record of the number of breaches helps the enforcing authorities determine the resources need to manage the enforcement.

A Conservation Area within Abbots Leigh?

Following a recent Conservation Area Survey conducted principally along Church Road, during which we were encouraged to find the majority of respondents were in favour of one, we have decided to arrange a Public Meeting to take place hopefully in September (at a date yet to be resolved) at which the concerns and queries which are arising can be openly addressed, with both The Parish Council and the Conservation and Heritage Officer of North Somerset on hand to answer questions.

Those participants involved in the original Survey as well as other interested residents living within our Parish will be welcome to attend (subject to Covid Rules in force at the time).

At present no decision has been taken on either a precise boundary for the Conservation Area, nor on whether the Parish Council intends to press forward formally with the Conservation Area after the Public Meeting.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The Independent Examiner completed his assessment of the draft Neighbourhood Plan and submitted a thirty page report to North Somerset Council in mid-May. The report makes a number of positive comments about the consultation processes, about the range of issues which had been covered and about the lay-out, structure and design of the Plan.

The headline conclusion was that, subject to the incorporation of a series of modifications, the Neighbourhood Plan should proceed to referendum.

Many of the modifications were designed to improve the wording of a policy so as to provide the clarity required by the National Planning Policy Framework and to relate specifically to the development management process. Other policies are already set out in existing NSC policies and were hence redundant. Others again were felt to be more appropriately formulated as Community Actions. The overall effect is that the amended plan presented to referendum will bring welcome benefit across the whole Neighbourhood Area offering 23 policies and 12 community actions relating to a range of housing, transport/movement, environment, heritage, economy, climate change and community assets and facility issues.

The proposal for the development of Orchard View in Ham Green as a care home and thirty housing units is supported subject to design and Green Belt considerations. On the site adjoining Chapel Pill Lane the Examiner recognised that national and local policies do allow for exception sites, that the Community Land Trust had brought forward an affordable housing site and that the extent of Green Belt in the neighbourhood area highlighted the difficulties in identifying a suitable site. He felt, however, that the draft Plan blurred the distinction between a planning policy and a planning application and took the view that it was inappropriate for a Neighbourhood Plan policy to allocate a site as a Green Belt exception before the necessary justification had been thoroughly explored by North Somerset Council through a planning application The affordable housing policy for Chapel Pill Lane (HO2) should therefore be deleted. Other than this procedural issue, the Examiner expressed no view on the merits of the scheme and left the decision on the planning application to be decided by North Somerset Council in the light of national and local planning policies and local planning considerations.

North Somerset Council will formally receive the Examination Report at its June 23rd Executive meeting in order to agree the modifications and the setting up of arrangements for a referendum. Given the time required to organise a referendum and the need to avoid the August holiday period it is likely that the referendum will be held in September.

RECYCLING AND RUBBISH

Recycling & waste services are now carried out by North Somerset Environment Company (NSEC), a new company set up by North Somerset Council with existing staff.

Collection days vary across Abbots Leigh and Leigh Woods. If in doubt about your next collection dates check North Somerset Council website under waste collections where you can also download your Recycling & Waste collection calendar.

Garden Waste

A new annual charge of \pounds 50 per garden waste bin is in place. If you haven't yet signed up, you need to do so straightaway. If you do not have permits on your green bins the Council will have stopped collecting them. Max. 2 bins per household. If you get a council tax discount on account of single person occupancy, or for any other reason, there is a reduced charge for your garden waste bins.

Recycling Centre at Black Rock, Portishead

Closed on Tuesdays. Summer times are 8am to 6pm on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 10am to 6pm on Thursday, 9am to 6pm on Saturday and 9am to 5pm on Sundays & Bank Holidays. When visiting Portishead recycling centre there is a one way system in place and it is not possible to make a right turn to enter or exit the site. To enter you must turn left coming down Valley road and to exit turn left towards Clevedon Road B3123.

Food waste

In the recent NSC household waste audit it was found that 45% of the residual general waste could have been recycled, 27% was food waste. The average family throws away about £700 worth of food waste a year and most of it ends up in landfill. Please help to reduce your general waste and put your food waste to better use. Put it in your food waste bin rather than your black wheelie bin so that it can be used to generate electricity and provide heat for homes.

Plastic Bags

A lot of these can be recycled at a number of larger supermarkets including a lot of food packaging and magazine wrappers which are not biodegradable. Read the packaging labels which say "recycle with bags at larger stores".

Spot the BEE FRIENDLY TREES round Abbots Leigh!

Much loved by those who know it: the Small-leaved Lime, aka Linden, Pry or Tilia cordata. In contrast to most other native trees, it struggles to spread naturally and doesn't colonize new territory unless deliberately planted. Where you find it in woodlands it has been growing succession for hundreds or thousands of years! We are privileged to have it on our door-steps, throughout Leigh Woods from Paradise Bottom to near the Suspension bridge, likely a remnant of the natural wild-woods of our area. Some individual Limes are also growing here and there around the village, <u>please let us know if</u> <u>you spot one!</u>

It is a lovely and very beneficial tree, well worth planting! Important for the local ecosystem, supporting lichens, fungi and animals, it is one of the suggested species to replace Ash trees lost to dieback. Many insects and larvae feed on it, bees love the flowers! Have a closer look and sniff at your nearest Lime when it flowers later in June - July and let us know if you have space to plant some Lime trees this Autumn!

ADRIAN'S ONE POT RECIPE OF THE MONTH: SWISS TARTIFLETTE

Ingredients:

- Some parboiled new potatoes
- A few rashers of smoked bacon cut into lardons
- A clove or two of garlic.

Method: Whilst the lardons are frying, thinly slice the parboiled potatoes and chop the garlic. Slice the cheese - use as much as you like depending on how rich you like your Tartiflette. When the bacon is lightly cooked, throw the whole lot into a gratin dish with a good glug of the wine. Bake for about 1/2 hour at the top of a hot oven until browned. As this dish came out of the oven and filled the kitchen with a blast of the aroma of melting Swiss cheese, I was taken back Proust-like to exhilarating lunches on the ski slopes.

- Dry white wine
- A soft Swiss cheese such as Reblochon but Italian Tallagio also works well



We crossed the border for the wine and enjoyed a glass or several of Austrian Grüner Veltliner.
